

# Maine High School Assessment (MHSA)

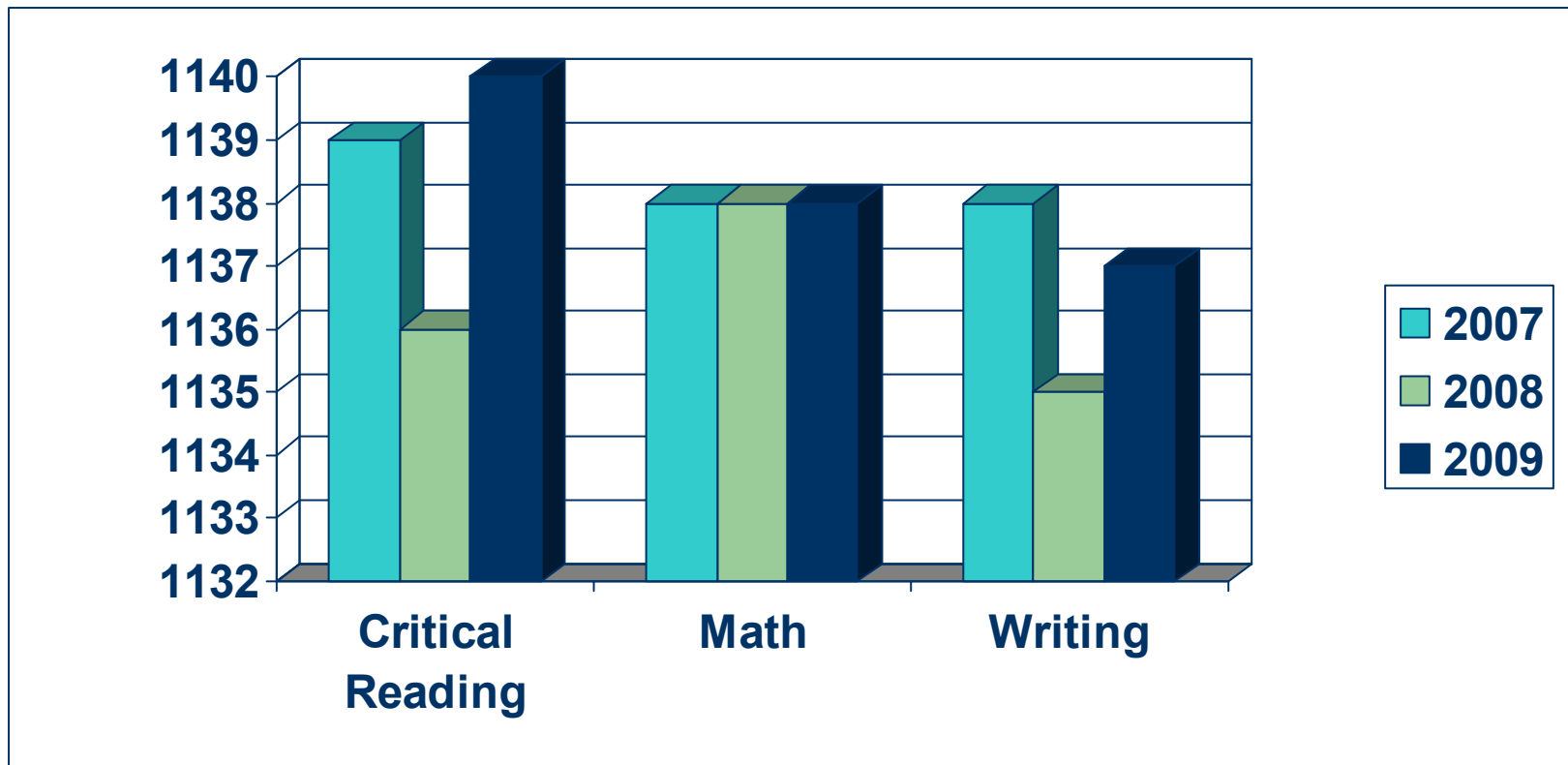

## 2009 Maine High School Assessment Average Scaled Scores

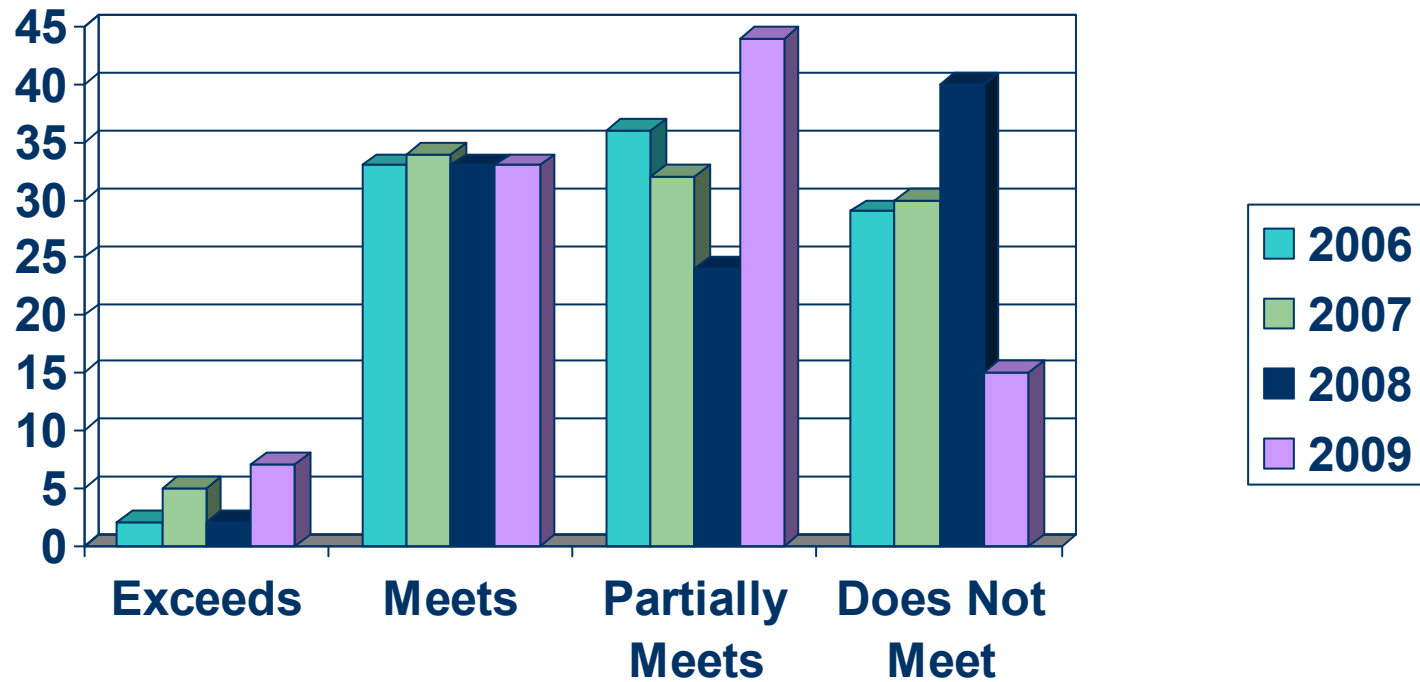

# 2007 - 2009 Maine High School Assessment Summary of Scores

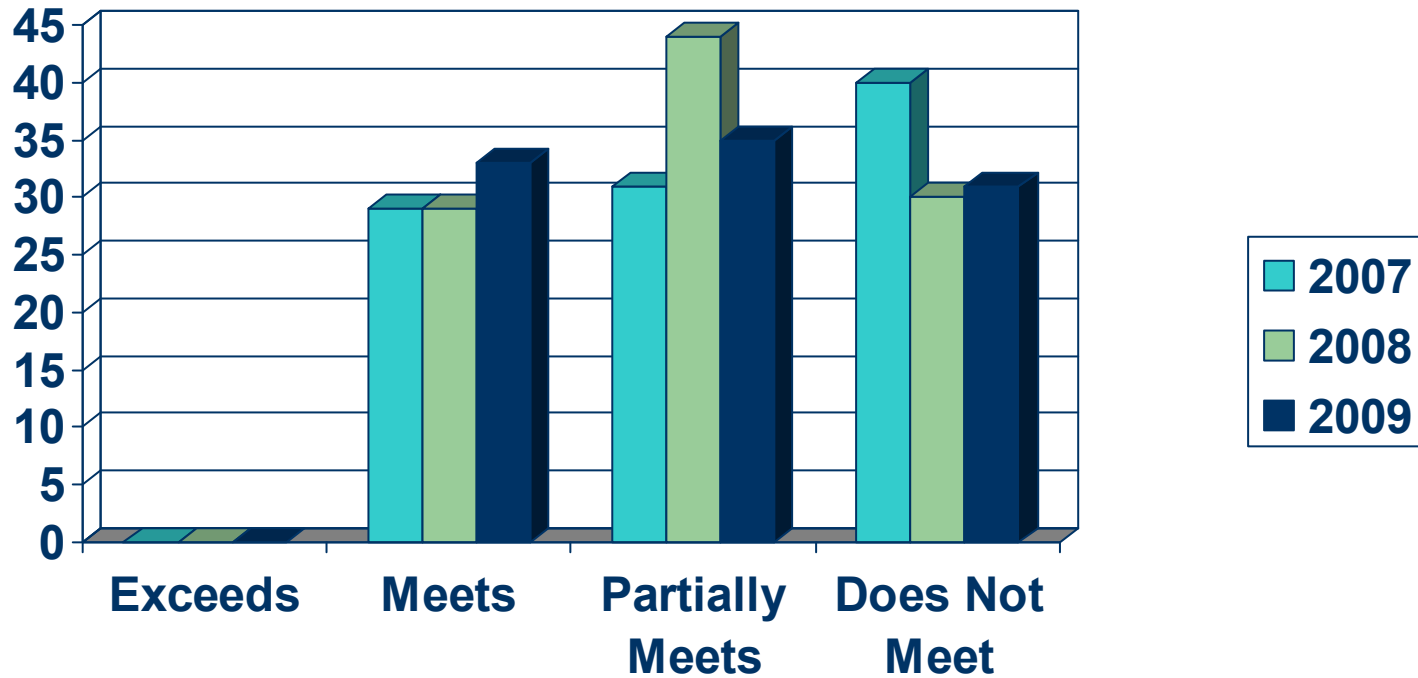

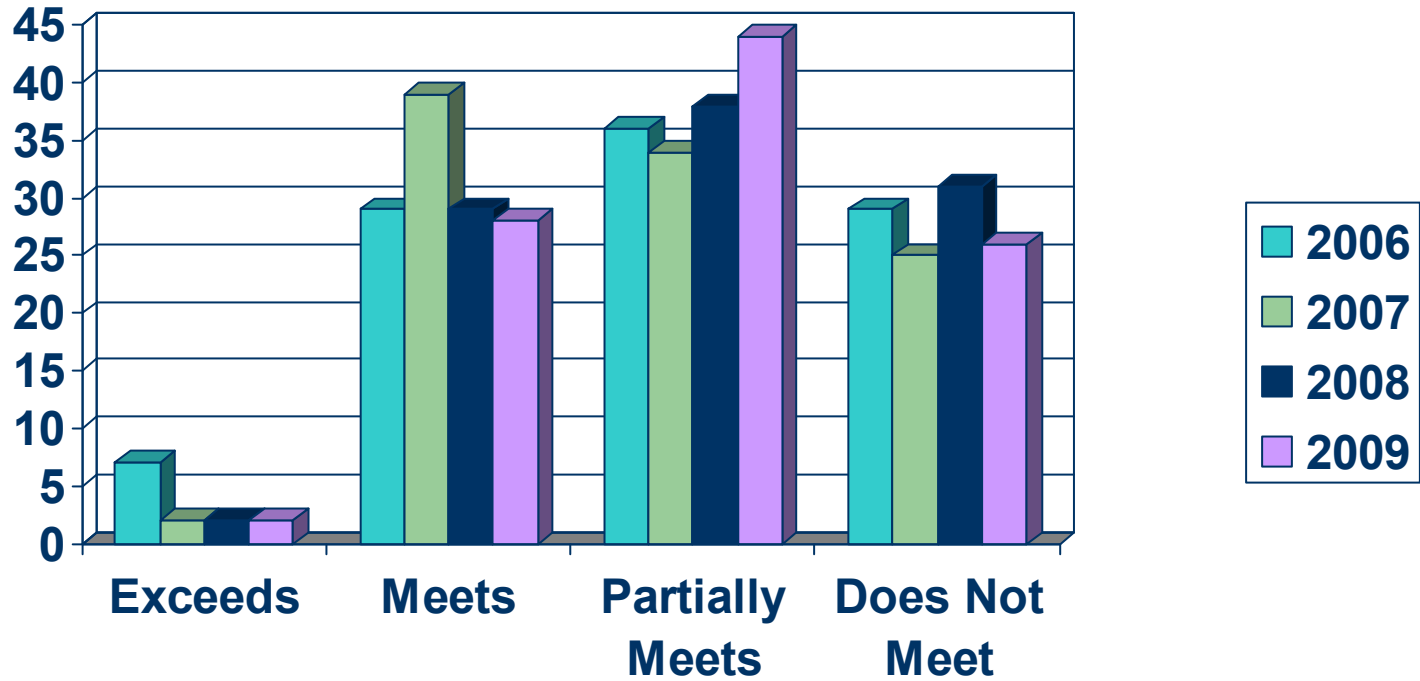

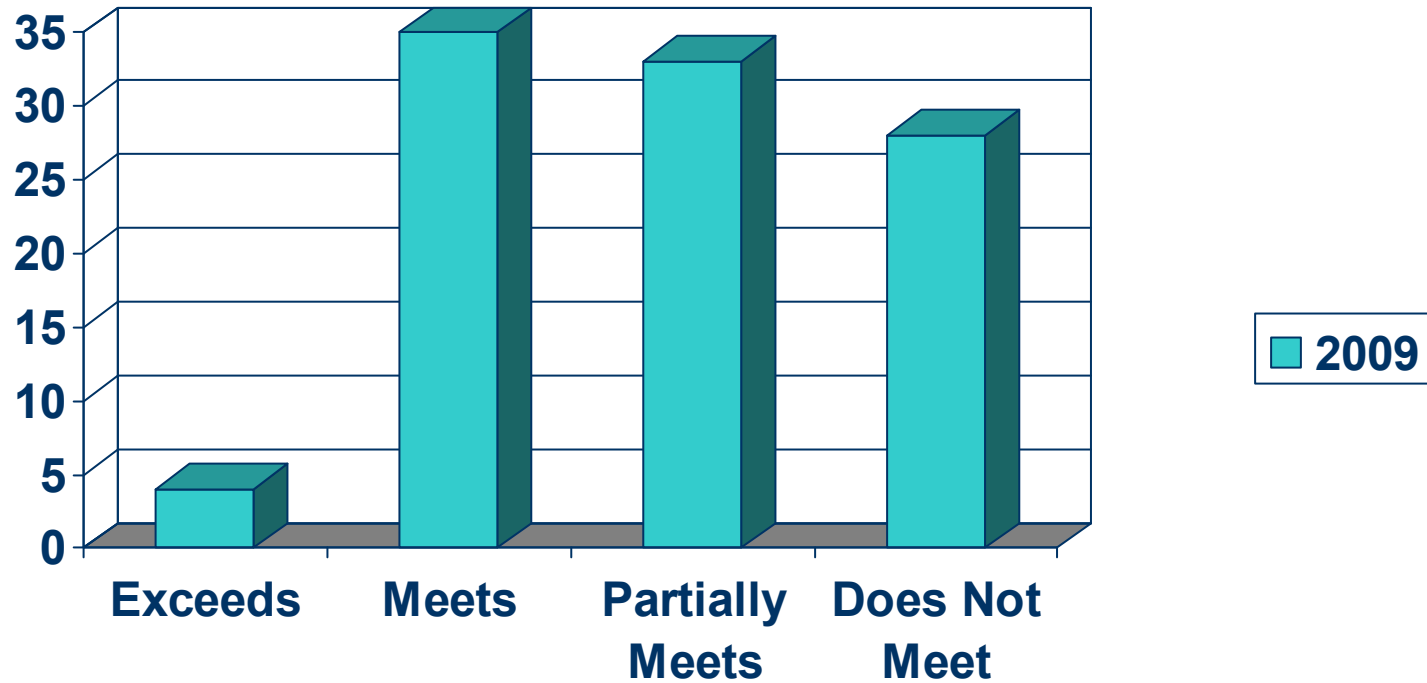
